What is an Official Plan?


- Outlines Policies on how land is to be used and developed.
- Sets the Vision and Goals and Objectives of the Community
- Created in 2007
- Updated in 2016





What is an Official Plan?

- An Official Plan is comprised of Schedules (maps) and Policies.
- General Policies
- Urban and Rural Land Use Policies
- Environmental, Parks, Servicing and Solid Waste, Transportation, Housing, Community Design, Sustainable Development and others





What is an Official Plan 5 Year Review?


Requirement under the Ontario Planning Act.

 Plan to remain current and up to date with on-going changes to Provincial and County documents.

 Opportunity to update the Plan with other recently approved Municipal Plans and Strategies

 A 5 year review is an update. Not a new Official Plan.

New Official Plan targeted for 2026.

Provincial Policy Statement Policy Direction on Matters of Provincial Interest

Official Plan Local policies and objectives relating to physical, social, economic and environmental growth and development of the Community

Zoning By-Law An Implementation Tool for the Official Plan which allows for regulation of land use

Other Tools

Such as Site Plan Control; License By-laws; Property Standards By-laws; Sign By-laws; Fencing By-laws; Engineering Standards...



- Provides the legislative framework for land use planning in Ontario
- It sets out how:
 - The land use planning system works
 - Who the decision makers are
 - How to resolve disputes
 - How the Public can provide input
- Allows the Minister of Municipal Affairs to issue Policy Statements
- The Planning Act has numerous approved and pending amendments:
 - Bill 245 Ontario Land Tribunal Act (2021)
 - Bill 197 Economic Recovery Act (2020)
 - Bill 108 More Homes, More Choice Act (2019)
 - Bill 88 Planning Act Amendment (2019)
 - Repeal of the Green Energy Act
 - Bill 138 Building Better Communities and Conserving Watersheds Act (2017)





Provincial Policy Statement (PPS 2020)


Issued under the authority of Section 3 of the Planning Act

• Provides direction on matters of provincial interest related to land-

use planning and development

 Promotes the provincial "policy-led" planning system.

- Updated most recently in 2020 (PPS 2020)
- All decisions affecting planning matters
 "shall be consistent with" policy statements
 issued under the Planning Act.






County of Grey Official Plan Town of The Blue Mountains Official Plan

- Provides a description of how Provincial Policies apply at a County and local Municipal Scale
- Provides objectives and policies to guide the short and long-term physical development of all lands within the County and Town; includes objectives related to social, economic and environmental matters too.
- Is a policy document with some flexibility in the application of its policies. This flexibility requires planning staff and Council to interpret Plan policies when making decisions on land use matters.
- Is put into action by the Zoning By-Law, Subdivision and Site Plan Control, through the current and future budgets, and by other by-laws, programs and activities of the Town.
- Public works and by-laws must conform to the applicable Official Plans.
